内容概要

作者简介

斯托(1811-1896),是美国女作家。生于康涅狄格州。父亲是著名牧师革曼·比彻。幼年因父亲关系颇受加尔文教派影响。青年时期因其叔父萨缪尔·福特的影响接受了自由主义信仰。她喜欢读司各特的浪漫小说,这在她后来的著作中有明显反映,1832年,她随全家迁往辛辛那提市,在一座女子学校教书,写了一些关于新英格兰生活的随笔。1836年,她与父亲所在的神学院的C.E.斯托教授结婚。其间,她访问了肯塔基州,目睹了那里奴隶的生活,这为她后来的小说提供了素材;她又受到父亲学校中强烈的反奴隶制情绪的影响。这种情绪成了她的小说的基调。1850年,她随丈夫迁至缅因州,那里关于反奴隶制的讨论使她无比激动,于是利用空闲时间写出了《汤姆叔叔的小屋》(1852)。小说引起强烈反响,使她一举成名。为了反驳保守势力的攻击,1853年她发表了《题解》,引用法律、法院档案、报纸和私人信件等大量材料证明她的小说所揭露的事实。她的其他主要著作有:《德雷德,阴暗的大沼地的故事》(1856),《奥尔岛上的明珠》(1862),《老镇上的人们》(1869),《粉色和白色的暴政》(1871),以及《宗教诗选》(1867)。她还写过一篇虚构的维护女权的论文《我妻子和我》(1871),这篇论文今天常常被女权主义者引用。斯托夫人是一位勤奋的多产作家,在她辛劳耕耘的三十年时间里,几乎每年出一本书。
